Dear Mr Moore,

Re: Hartlepool Mayoral Development Corporation

It was noted with interest the recent vote amongst Hartlepool Councillors to approve the proposed Mayoral Development Corporation in Hartlepool. Whilst HUST are a non-politically aligned Organisation, part of our role is to support the safeguarding of Hartlepool United Football Club. Hartlepool Borough Council have always supported this view and we appreciate the dialogue and support the council have previously offered which has always provided reassurance that the council see Hartlepool United, including Victoria Park (currently known as the Suit Direct Stadium) protected and the club continue to be at the heart of the community.

The recent vote we refer to does raise some questions that we hope you can provide reassurance to HUST and the wider HUFC fan-base. We would be therefore grateful if you could provide some answers to the following:

- Is Victoria Park currently, or potentially, on the 'list of assets' that could transfer into the new Mayoral Development Corporation?
- If this is the case, then can you confirm that the MDC will respect the Asset of Community Value that is currently in place if the land the ground sits on is subsequently bought by any private companies, including the football club itself?
- It is noted that the land behind the Neale Cooper stand appears to be on the list of assets that may transfer to the MDC. Are there any plans afoot for this to be developed/sold by the MDC that may have an impact on the football club and/or Victoria Park including current or future owners of HUFC?
- If there are any plans from the MDC that may impact on the football club, then can the MDC commit to consulting with HUST/wider supporters regarding this before any plans are finalised?
